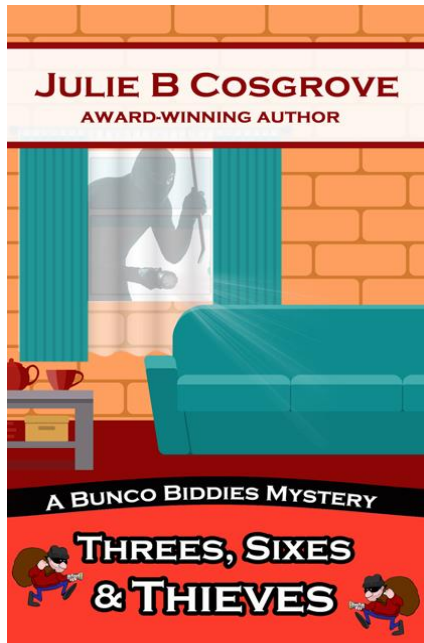

Discussion:

Question 4: Why did Janie feel compelled to follow Hornsby? Have you ever felt compelled to do something and did it before praying about it first?

Answer 4: She let her curiosity get the better of her.

Question 5: The Bunco Biddies took turns watching their friend's house. How are we Christians supposed to watch out for each other?

Answer 5: Through prayer, love, and fellowship, to keep each accountable. Hebrews 10:24-25

Question 6: Why did the Bunco Biddies gather together in prayer?

Answer 6: They took their friend's welfare to the Lord to protect him when they could not. Have you ever done this?

Question 7: Why did George insist on spending the night with Betsy Ann, in spite of how it might appear to others?

Answer 7: To protect her because he loved her. That was more important to him.

Question 8: What was the reaction to them spending the night together?

Answer 8: Janie knew them well enough to know all would be proper. Babs empathized because her hubby did the same for her.

Question 9: Why did Armie kill Joe?

Answer 9 Greed, and suspicion. When has greed, envy, suspicion or anger led you to do something you shouldn't?

Question 10: Why did Arnie shoot Hornsby, whom he had killed others in order to seek misguided justice for Hornsby?

Answer 10: He had gotten too deep in his crime, so his sense of justice was skewed. He may have felt Hornsby betrayed him, too. Have you ever made a judgmental mistake? What was the outcome?
