

Discussion:

Answer 2: Jeremiah 3:33

Question 3: Nehemiah worked with a sword in one hand and a trowel in the other. Have you ever felt like that?

Answer 3: Nehemiah 4:15-17

Question 4: Mistakes from our past are forgiven, but not always without consequence. What were some of the far-reaching consequences of Ben's poor choices?

Answer 4: Psalm 51:2-3

Question 5: Tradition drove Rosa and Lil's father to leave his land to his oldest child. But the blessing ultimately fell to Lil, his youngest. When has God demonstrated to you that His ways are higher than our ways?

Answer 5: Isaiah 55:8

Question 6: Lil had finally landed her dream job, yet felt as though she possessed the hollow chest of a doll, rather than the heartbeat of a child, and didn't know why. Before you came to Christ, do you remember feeling dead inside? What was significantly different about you after you accepted Christ?

Answer 6: Ephesians 2:4-5

Question 7: Ben told his dad he loved him, even though the affection was never returned because he didn't want to have any regrets when his dad (or he) passed away. Is there something you do without reciprocation simply because it's the right thing to do, knowing the reward will come later?

Answer 7: Matthew 6:20

Question 8: Ben questioned Delbert's reasoning, but obliged him out of respect. Have you ever had to defy the wishes of an elder for their own safety? How did you handle it?

Answer 8: I Timothy 5:1 and James 1:5

Question 9: Lil said she had never seen anyone die so peacefully. We've heard testimonies of martyrs dying brutal deaths with a peaceful expression on their faces. Why do we not fear death?

Answer 9 1 Thessalonians 4:13

Question 10: Even though he wanted her, Ben stood strong on his convictions, and let Lil walk away. What looked like the loss of something was really just a seed being buried in the ground. Have you ever experienced the "death of a vision", only to have it resurrected in God's perfect time?

Answer 10: John 12:24 Sometimes it seems as if our hopes and dreams will never come true, and that the night is very long. But God's timing is always perfect and His promises will come to pass, if only we'll trust Him and wait for morning to come.
